III. ACTION ITEMS

A. Approval of Resolution 2025-13 – Adoption of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan

The Lake~Sumter Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is seeking approval of Resolution 2025-13 to formally adopt the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). This plan was developed with a strategic focus on implementation, emphasizing the first 10 years of the 20-year planning horizon.

The 2050 Cost Feasible Plan introduces a new methodology for long-range transportation planning by incorporating annual funding estimates and detailed project planning. This approach enhances alignment with existing MPO documents and ensures a more cohesive and actionable framework for transportation investment.

The DRAFT 2050 Cost Feasible Plan was presented to the MPO Board on October 22nd, initiating the public review period. Feedback received during this period has been considered in the final version of the plan now presented for adoption.

Approval of Resolution 2025-13 will authorize the MPO to move forward with the implementation of the 2050 LRTP, guiding transportation priorities and investments across Lake and Sumter counties through 2050.

B. Approval of Resolution 2025-12: Amendment to the FY 2026–2030 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has requested that the Lake~Sumter Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) amend the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026–2030 Transportation

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Improvement Program (TIP) to include the addition of a railroad and utility phase for Project #422570-3: South Lake Trail Phase IIIB.

This amendment is necessary to ensure the project's continued development and to align with FDOT's updated project scope and funding schedule. The inclusion of the railroad and utility phase will support the advancement of this critical regional trail segment, which enhances multimodal connectivity and promotes active transportation in the South Lake area.

Requested Action:

Approve Resolution 2025-12 amending the FY 2026–2030 TIP to incorporate the railroad and utility phase for Project #422570-3, South Lake Trail Phase IIIB, as requested by FDOT. Roll Call Vote required

C. MPO Executive Director Annual Evaluation

In accordance with the Employment Agreement between the Lake~Sumter MPO and Executive Director Michael F. Woods, an annual performance evaluation is required to be completed by October of each year. The Agreement remains in effect until terminated by either party. Mr. Woods has served as Executive Director since September 30, 2018.

The MPO Attorneys' Office has collected written performance evaluations from the Chair and members of the MPO Executive Committee. Summaries of these evaluations were reviewed and discussed during the Executive Committee meeting held on October 22, 2025. Based on the evaluation outcomes, the Committee approved a recommendation for a merit-based salary increase.

MPO Attorney Melissa Martinez will lead the Board's discussion regarding Mr. Woods' evaluation and the terms of his Employment Agreement.

A. FDOT District Five Tentative Work Program (TWP) Public Hearing for FYs 2027–2031

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Five has released its Tentative Five-Year Work Program for public review. This program outlines transportation projects scheduled for Fiscal Years 2026/27 through 2030/31, covering the period from July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2031.

Following the conclusion of the public comment period, the Tentative Work Program will undergo review by the Florida Legislature and the Governor. Final adoption is scheduled for July 1, 2026, by the State Secretary of Transportation.

This public hearing provides an opportunity for the Lake~Sumter MPO Board and the public to review and comment on the proposed projects and priorities within the region.






Partially Funded vs. Fully Funded

Project Development & Environment Study

Design concept options and their social and environmental effects are examined.



Design

Detailed construction plans are prepared.



Right of Way

Entails acquisition of any necessary right-of-way, based on the design plans.



Environmental Permitting

Includes agency coordination and obtaining necessary permits for project to move forward.



Construction

The project is built during this phase.



CE

Construction Engineering and Inspection
Contracted service that administers, monitors, and inspects
construction projects on behalf of FDOT.

- However, only planning phases for projects were funded by 2045




How long does a project take to complete?

2050 Financial Forecast





- New Call for Projects New Box funding program will allow for smaller push button projects to be funded with MPO funding support
- Local Funding Local funding discussions can happen annually for advancing project with Federal / State / Local partnerships




LAKE COUNTY CONNECTION RIDERSHIP FISCAL YEAR COMPARISON





This letter and enclosures are to comply with Subsection 339.135(4)(c) 3 and (d), Florida Statutes, which require the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to provide Metropolitan / Transportation Planning Organizations (M/TPOs) with a written explanation for any project in the MPO's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), which is proposed to be rescheduled or deleted for the common four years (Fiscal Year 2026/27 to Fiscal Year 2029/30) of the Department's Adopted and Tentative Work Programs. In addition, FDOT must provide justification for projects included in the TIP but not in the Department's Work Program, if applicable.

The MPO may request in writing that District Five Secretary John E. Tyler, P.E., consider changes to the Tentative Five-Year Work Program. The District Secretary is required to submit all such requests, along with the Tentative Five-Year Work Program, to the FDOT Secretary, Jared W. Perdue, P.E., and the Florida Transportation Commission.
