The draft five-year Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) document is based on several funding sources, especially the FDOT Tentative Work Program. Each year, FDOT conducts a process of proposing a Tentative Work Program, which occurred in December 2018. The tentative program covers the period from October 1, 2019, through June 30, 2024. Therefore, the MPO is required to adopt a new five-year TIP no later than the July 15, 2019 in order to concur and to be consistent with the projects in the FDOT program. The MPO Governing Board is requested to approve the draft document and to also acknowledge the closing of the public review period.
