The Chair, Chair-Elect, 1st Vice Chair, 2nd Vice Chair, and immediate Past Chair and one voting member elected by the MPO Governing Board shall be appointed to serve as the three primary and three alternate appointments to the Central Florida MPO Alliance. The Executive Committee shall designate which of the positions shall serve in a primary capacity and which shall serve in an alternate capacity.

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) requests Lake-Sumter MPO amend the FY 2025 - 2029 TIP as described below.





- Construction Cost: \$45 million
- **Description:** This is a project to widen U.S. 441/U.S. 27/State Road (S.R.) 500 from four to six lanes between Lake Ella Road and Avenida Central. Both northbound and southbound U.S. 441 will be expanded from two to three lanes, and bicycle lanes and sidewalks will be added along the length of


the project. The FDOT will also do drainage work, add signage, make lighting upgrades, make median access changes, and improve the aesthetics of the roadway with new landscaping. A key aspect of the project will be the removal of U.S. 441 bridges over County Road (C.R.) 25, and the creation of a new, at-grade intersection at that location. C.R. 25 will connect with U.S. 441 on the east side of the highway via a signalized intersection but will end as a cul-de-sac on the west side of U.S. 441. **Update:** Contractor is still working on punch-list items.



- Construction Cost: \$15.3 million
- **Description:** The intent of this project is to rehabilitate the asphalt pavement and improve operations and safety along State Road (S.R.) 19. Sidewalk improvements are also planned from South Florida Avenue to East Lakeview Avenue. In addition to repaving this 12-mile segment of S.R. 19, the project proposes widening S.R. 19 around County Road 478 to provide a new southbound left turn lane. Other roadside improvements such as reducing the side slopes and adjusting driveway connections are planned. Bridge safety improvements will be made at the U.S. 27 and Florida's Turnpike overpasses.

Update: The contractor working on drainage installation at Cherry Lake Road and widening S.R. 19 at Wynn Road. Contractor also working on U.S. 27 on ramps on S.R. 19.



• **Description:** The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) will enhance safety and operations on State Road (S.R.) 19 from north of Stevens Avenue to County Road (C.R.) 452 in Eustis. S.R. 19 splits through the City of Eustis, with northbound lanes known as Grove Street and southbound lanes known as Bay Street. Both sides of the roadway will be resurfaced. Raised crosswalks will be added on Grove Street at Magnolia and Gottsche Avenues, and on Bay Street at Magnolia, McDonald, and Clifford Avenues to reduce vehicle speeds. Curb extensions will improve pedestrian visibility and reduce crossing distances. Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB) will be installed on Grove Street at Norton, Lemon, McDonald, Gottsche, and Eustis Streets, as well as on Bay Street at Magnolia and McDonald Avenues. Shared lane markers, or "sharrows," will denote shared lanes for cyclists and motorists on both streets. The project will also include upgraded lighting, drainage, traffic and pedestrian signals, landscaping, signs, striping, and pavement markings.

Update: The contractor is working on raised intersections, cutting bulb outs, and finishing curbs.



• **Description:** This Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) project will extend the life of the existing roadway by milling and resurfacing the eastbound travel lanes of State Road (S.R.) 33/S.R. 50 (Orange Street) from east of Ivey Street—where the road diverges from the westbound lanes—to Crittenden Street. To enhance pedestrian safety, this project will construct a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) west of Alabama Avenue, and two Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFB)—one east of Georgia Avenue and the other west of Indiana Avenue. Other improvements include the construction of curbed islands, reconstruction of sidewalks and driveways, installation of signs and pavement markings, and signal modification at North Lake Avenue and South Main Avenue.

Update: Contractor continues the installation of pedestrian signal boxes and signalization.

• **Description:** The intent of this project is to resurface the segment of U.S. 27 (State Road 25) from north of Lake Louisa Road to north of Cluster Oak Drive in Clermont. To enhance bicycle safety, the travel lanes will be restriped to create 7-foot-wide buffered bicycle lanes on each side of the road. Pedestrian enhancements include upgrading pedestrian curb ramps to current Americans with

Disabilities Act (ADA) standards and constructing sidewalk along the southwest corner of Brogden Drive. This project will also require minor drainage and signal improvements to satisfy the needs of the project.

Update: Contractor in final stages, conducting laser profile and waiting for asphalt to cure for striping.






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


LAKE COUNTY CONNECTION RIDERSHIP COMPARISON

Transportation Projects

ADA Accessible Bus Stop Pads

In Fiscal Year 2023, 40 ADA-accessible LakeXpress bus stop pads were installed throughout the system. In Fiscal Year 2024, 35 accessible bus stop pads have been built with additional pads to be built based on grant funding availability.

Second Xpress Commuter Route Added

Thanks to the Florida Department of Transportation awarding Lake County a three year Service Development Grant, LakeXpress is began it's second Xpress Route, the "27 Xpress!" The 27 Xpress connects LakeXpress' Northern route and Southern routes, operating between the Leesburg Citizens Boulevard Transfer Station and the Clermont Park and Ride Transfer Station while also serving the Christopher C. Ford Commerce Park. The Route operates weekdays, between the commuter hours of 6:00 AM and 9:50 AM and again between 4:00 PM and 7:50 PM.

Route 1A Extension to Summerfield

Route 1A was extended to the Summerfield Walmart in Marion County. The extension of the route operates as an express service, only stopping at UF Hospital The Villages and the Summerfield Walmart on the Northbound and Southbound trips.

New Buses

Lake County Transit took delivery of five new LakeXpress (fixed route) buses in August and three new Lake County Connection (paratransit) buses in October!



Figure 1: Trips by Trip Purpose



Figure 2: Total Passenger Miles



Figure 3: Total Passenger Trips



Figure 4: On-Time Performance



Figure 5: Sumter County Transit Fund



Figure 6: Sumter County Transit Revenue






Figure 9: Survey Rating Totals by Type
