A. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #1

Recommendation of Approval of Emergency Resolution 2024-9 Amending the 2025-2029 TIP. The MPO processed an Emergency TIP Amendment as per MPO Bylaws to include the Roll-Forward projects from the FDOT Work program for fiscal year 2025.

The 2025 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) roll forward amendment ensures that the first year of the TIP, adopted by the Board on June 19th, 2024, matches year one of the FDOT Work Program.

B. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #2

Recommendation of Approval of Resolution 2024-10 Amending the 2025-2029 TIP. This Amendment Includes:

- a. Project #447990-2 a local agency program (LAP) project managed by the City of Leesburg. The City has opted to use District Five's continuing services contract for design services. There is no additional money added to the project but a second segment (-2) for the project is added to the TIP.
- b. To achieve planning consistency for the US 301 widening project (#430132) the project has been programmed into three separate segments. As such, project limits have changed on #430132-1, a new segment #430132-3 has been added. Some funding increases are reflected for the Design-Build (DSB) phase and funds for the design-build (DSB) phase have been moved from 4301321-1 to 430132-3. The amendments are for project phase and costs which have changed in FY 2025 only. Project #430132-2 is not affected, however, to be completely transparent, all project details and funding totals are provided for the MPO. Exhibit A
- c. Adding Project #452074-2 to the TIP in FY 2025. This project is part of improvements along I-75 funded through the Moving Florida Forward program. This project will be delivered using the design-build method and will construct auxiliary lanes on I-75 from south of SR 44 to SR 200. Adding funds in the amount of \$232,191,543 in FY 2025 as shown in Exhibit B.
- d. Adding a Railroad/Utilities Phase to Project #427056-1 in FY 2025. This project is on SR 50 in Groveland.

The Central Florida Safety Strategic Plan (CFSSP) is a bold framework on how state and local communities will work together across Central Florida to address safety challenges on our roads. FDOT invites you to view and share the CFSSP with your partners, stakeholders, and communities.

Reducing and eliminating severe injuries and fatalities in our region will require collaboration, teamwork, and partnerships across all agencies and stakeholders. Through this collaboration, the CFSSP was created.

- 1. Focuses on safer street designs and changing behaviors and prioritizes getting to zero fatalities and serious injuries.
- 2. Identifies internal and external opportunities for collaboration and enhancements in meeting District 5's goals of getting to zero.
- 3. Builds upon the excellent Vision Zero work being done by our partners throughout District 5.
- 4. Creates an action-oriented 5-year plan with 1-year, 3-year, and 5-year goals to facilitate advancements in getting to zero across District 5.

Sumter County Commissioner Estep currently serves on the CFSSP Steering Committee until he leaves office this November. Commissioner Estep recommends City of Wildwood Commissioner Joseph Elliott to serve on the CFSSP Steering Committee as his replacement.

The Lake~Sumter MPO Board approved our Apportionment plan at the October 25, 2023, regular Board meeting and the Governor approved the Apportionment Plan in July 2024. Staff was asked to revisit the Apportionment Plan at the June 2024 meeting with the intent to reduce the number of voting members. Attached are the Apportionment Plan Scenarios that were discussed in 2023. Changes to the make up of the voting members requires a MPO Bylaw amendment.

EMERGENCY RESOLUTION OF THE LAKE~SUMTER METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION AMENDING THE FYS 2025 - 2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) TO INCLUDE THE ROLL FORWARD PROJECTS IN THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION WORK PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025

WHEREAS, the Lake~Sumter Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for the Lake-Sumter MPO Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, Section 339.175, Florida Statutes, 23 U.S.C. Section 134, and Title 49 U.S.C. require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, must have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, 23 U.S.C. Section 134(j) and Section 339.175(8), Florida Statutes, require the MPO to formulate a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), defined by 23 C.F.R. Section 450.104 as a prioritized listing/program of transportation projects that are developed and formally adopted by an MPO as part of the metropolitan transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS, Section 339.175(8), Florida Statutes, requires that the TIP include projects and project phases to be funded with state or federal funds that are recommended for advancement during the next fiscal year and four subsequent fiscal years; and

WHEREAS, FYs 2025 – 2029 TIP was adopted by the MPO on June 19, 2024, based on programmed projects in the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Five Year Work Program; and

WHEREAS, to achieve consistency and address roll-forward funds from the previous fiscal year and adjustments to the FDOT Work Program, the FDOT has requested in an e-mail message dated July 3, 2024, that the MPO amend the FYs 2025 – 2029 TIP to address necessary revisions and additions listed in Exhibit A, attached hereto, and incorporated herein, with those amendments to become effective October 1, 2024, and

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the MPO is authorized by Section 1.8 of the Bylaws, entitled *Emergency Revisions and Amendments*, to execute an emergency resolution so long as such resolution comes before the Executive Committee for recommendation and the Governing Board for ratification at the next regularly scheduled meetings.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lake~Sumter MPO that the:

RESOLUTION 2024-9 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AMENDMENT

- Due to the request by the State of Florida, Department of Transportation, an expedited TIP Amendment is needed for transportation improvement program and, finding that an emergency meeting of the MPO Executive Committee is not feasible, it has been determined by the undersigned that an Emergency Resolution is necessary.
- The Executive Director of the MPO is authorized to sign and transmit this resolution to the appropriate agencies as set forth in Section 1.8 of the Bylaws, entitled Emergency Revisions and Amendments. This resolution will come before the MPO Executive Committee for recommendation and the MPO Governing Board for ratification at the next regularly scheduled meeting. Should the Governing Board take action to disapprove this resolution, state and federal agencies shall be notified by the end of the following business day of the Governing Board's action.
- 3. FY 2025 2029 TIP is hereby endorsed and amended (Exhibit A),
- 4. The Executive Director of the Lake~Sumter MPO is hereby authorized and directed to submit the amended FY 2025 2029 TIP to the following:

RE: Request to Amend Fiscal Year (FY) 2025-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) – Annual Roll Forward

Dear Mr. Woods:

The purpose of this letter is to request Lake-Sumter MPO amend the FY 2025-2029 TIP with the Annual Roll-Forward Report. The Roll Forward report reconciles differences between the TIP and Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Adopted Five-Year Work Program. This annual process is routine and assists the MPO with identifying projects using federal funds that were not authorized during the previous state fiscal year (FY 2024). These projects have automatically "rolled forward" in the FDOT Adopted Five-Year Work Program as of July 1, 2024. This amendment ensures that year one of the TIP matches year one of FDOT's Adopted Five-year Work Program.

The reason for this amendment is to ensure projects with federal funding can be authorized prior to the new Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) beginning on October 1 each year. Until then, Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) continue to recognize the FY 2024 – 2028 TIP as the effective document. Adopting the Roll Forward Report and amending it into the FY 2025-2029 TIP ensures projects will continue to be authorized without interruption.

The affected projects are listed in the attached Roll-Forward Report dated July 1, 2024. The MPO is requested to add this report to the FY 2025-2029 TIP in its entirety.

RESOLUTION OF THE LAKE~SUMTER METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION; AMENDING THE FYS 2025-2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) ADDING PROJECT #447990-2 A LOCAL AGENCY PROGRAM (LAP) PROJECT MANAGED BY THE CITY OF LEESBURG. THE CITY OF LEESBURG HAS OPTED TO USE DISTRICT FIVE'S CONTINUING SERVICES CONTRACT FOR DESIGN SERVICES. THERE IS NO ADDITIONAL MONEY ADDED TO THE PROJECT BUT A SECOND SEGMENT (-2) FOR THE PROJECT IS ADDED TO THE TIP.
- (2) TO ACHIEVE PLANNING CONSISTENCY FOR THE US 301 WIDENING PROJECT (#430132) THE PROJECT HAS BEEN PROGRAMMED INTO THREE SEPARATE SEGMENTS. AS SUCH, PROJECT LIMITS HAVE CHANGED ON #430132-1. A NEW SEGMENT #430132-3 HAS BEEN ADDED. SOME FUNDING INCREASES ARE REFLECTED FOR THE DESIGN-BUILD (DSB) PHASE AND FUNDS FOR THE DESIGN-BUILD (DSB) PHASE HAVE BEEN MOVED FROM 430132-1 TO 430132-3. THE AMENDMENTS ARE FOR PROJECT PHASE AND COSTS WHICH HAVE CHANGED IN FY 2025 ONLY
- (3) ADDING PROJECT #452074-2. A NEW PROJECT TO THE TIP IN FY 25. THIS PROJECT IS PART OF IMPROVEMENTS ALONG I-75 FUNDED THROUGH THE MOVING FLORIDA FORWARD PROGRAM. THIS PROJECT WILL BE DELIVERED USING THE DESIGN-BUILD METHOD AND WILL CONSTRUCT AUXILIARY LANES ON I-75 FROM SOUTH OF SR 44 TO SR 200.
- (4) ADDING A RAILROAD/UTILITIES PHASE TO PROJECT #427056-1 IN FY 25. THIS PROJECT IS ON SR 50 FROM CR 565 TO CR 565A AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF THE TIP AMENDMENT TO THE APPROPRIATE AGENCIES.

WHEREAS, the Lake~Sumter Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the duly designated and constituted body responsible for carrying out the urban transportation planning and programming process for Lake-Sumter MPO Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, Section 339.175, Florida Statutes; 23 U.S.C. Section 134; and Title 49 U.S.C. require that the urbanized area, as a condition to the receipt of federal capital or operating assistance, must have a continuing, cooperative, and comprehensive transportation planning process that results in plans and programs consistent with the comprehensively planned development of the urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, 23 U.S.C. Section 134(j) and Section 339.175(8), Florida Statutes, require the Lake~Sumter MPO to formulate a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), defined by 23 C.F.R. Section 450.104 as a prioritized listing/program of transportation projects that are developed and formally adopted by an MPO as part of the metropolitan transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS, Section 339.175(8), Florida Statutes, requires that the TIP include projects and project phases to be funded with state or federal funds that are recommended for advancement during the next fiscal year and four subsequent fiscal years; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has requested the MPO's TIP be amended to add Project #447990-2 a local agency program (LAP) project managed by the City of Leesburg. The City of Leesburg has opted to use District Five's continuing services contract for design services. There is no additional money added to the project but a second segment (-2) for the project is added to the TIP; and

WHEREAS, FDOT has requested the MPO's TIP be amended to achieve planning consistency for the US 301 widening project (#430132) as the project has been programmed into three separate segments. As such, project limits have changed on #430132-1, a new segment #430132-3 has been added. Some funding increases are reflected for the Design-Build (DSB) phase and funds for the design-build (DSB) phase have been moved from 430132-1 to 430132-3. The amendments are for project phase and costs which have changed in FY 2025 only. Project #430132-2 is not affected, however, to be completely transparent, all project details and funding totals are provided in Exhibit A; attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, FDOT has requested the MPO's TIP be amended to add Project #452074-2 to the TIP in FY 2025. This project is part of improvements along I-75 funded through the Moving Florida Forward program. This project will be delivered using the design-build method and will construct auxiliary lanes on I-75 from south of SR 44 to SR 200. Adding funds in the amount of \$232,191,543 in FY 2025 as shown in **Exhibit B**; attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, FDOT has requested the MPO's TIP be amended to add a railroad/utilities phase to project #427056-1 in FY 2025. This project is on SR 50 from CR 565 to CR 565A. Adding funding in FY 2025 in the amount of \$4000, as shown in **Exhibit B**.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Lake~Sumter MPO that the:

- 1. FY 2025-2029 TIP is hereby amended adding Project #447990-2 a LAP project managed by the City of Leesburg. The City of Leesburg has opted to use District Five's continuing services contract for design services. 2020 Urbanized Area & Potential Adjusted Boundary

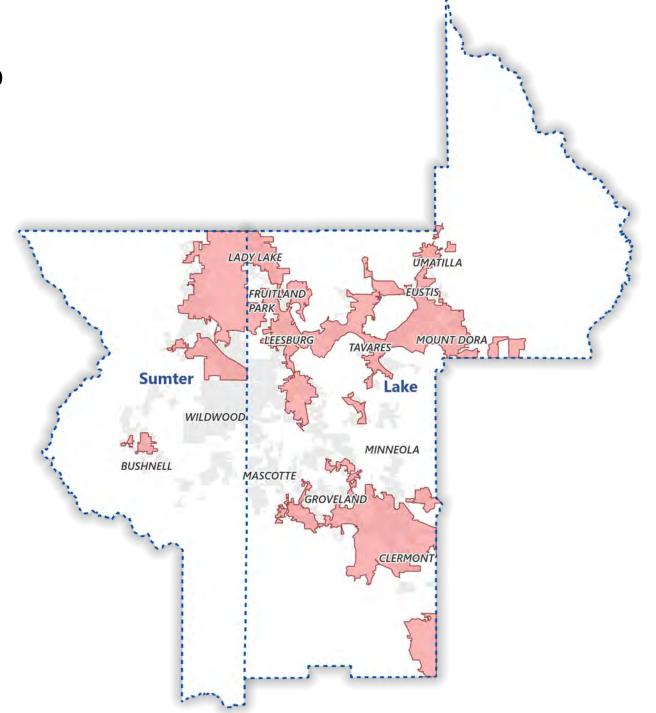

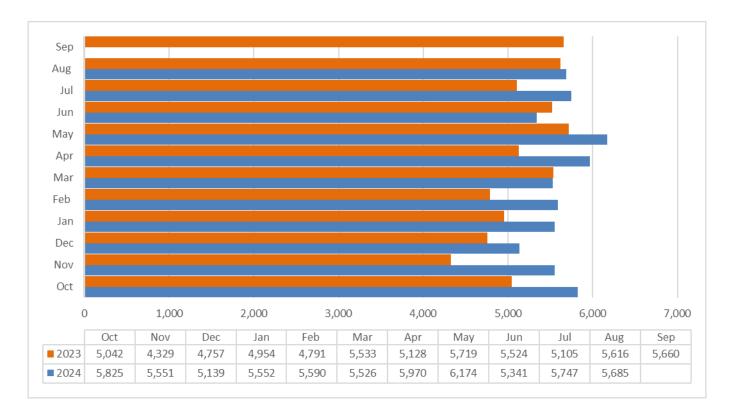




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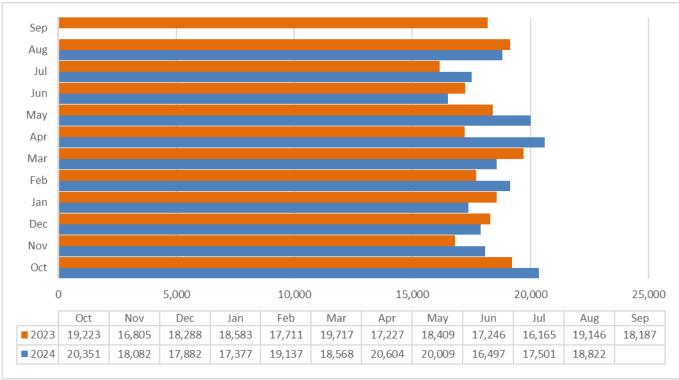


LAKE COUNTY CONNECTION RIDERSHIP COMPARISON

Transportation Projects

ADA Accessible Bus Stop Pads

In Fiscal Year 2023, 40 ADA-accessible LakeXpress bus stop pads were installed throughout the system. In Fiscal Year 2024, 35 accessible bus stop pads have been built with additional pads to be built based on grant funding availability.

Second Xpress Commuter Route Added

Thanks to the Florida Department of Transportation awarding Lake County a three year Service Development Grant, LakeXpress is opening it's second Xpress Route, the "27 Xpress!" The 27 Xpress will connect LakeXpress' Northern route and Southern routes, operating between the Leesburg Citizens Boulevard Transfer Station and the Clermont Park and Ride Transfer Station while also serving the Christopher C. Ford Commerce Park. The Route will operate weekdays, between the commuter hours of 6:00 AM and 9:50 AM and again between 4:00 PM and 7:50 PM.

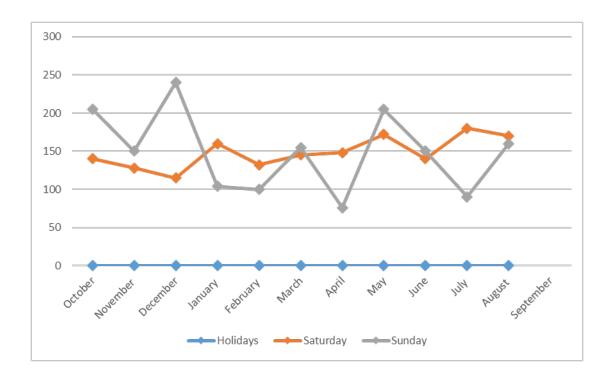
Route 1A Extension to Summerfield
