  An amendment is needed to add a needed study of CR 435 to determine the impacts of the

  Wekiva Parkway and the new CR 46A interchange on this county road connecting eastern Lake

  County with northwest Orange County. The roadway study is not currently in the LOPP.
- C. Recommend Approval of Urban Area Boundaries and Functional Classification Maps
  At the November TAC meeting, FHWA and FDOT District 5 staff presented the draft Urban Area
  Boundary Map and explained the relationship between the maps and project funding eligibility. A
  resolution will be presented to the Governing Board January 22 authorizing the chairman to sign
  the maps. Committee input is sought before the maps are presented to the MPO Governing Board.

D. Recommend Approval of Draft FY 2014/15 Transportation Management System Budget Staff is providing the Draft FY 2014/15 TMS Budget for review and approval. The draft budget is presented proactively due to a requirement in the TMS Interlocal Agreement for distribution of the budget by March 31. This allows opportunity for each local government to incorporate the new TMS amount for the fiscal year beginning Oct. 1.

The TMS budget was reduced again in FY 2012/13 after a series of cuts and new investment of federal funds. Last fiscal year, the budget was maintained at the previous year's amounts. However \$40,000 in federal MPO funds were committed at this point to the TMS. For FY 2014/15, the MPO is facing an increase in contract costs in maintaining TMS data such as traffic counts and crash data. In addition, staffing has been reduced while fixed staffing costs have increased throughout the last four fiscal years. Therefore, the TMS draft budget proposed by staff proposes a 10 percent increase across the board for all local governments. This would restore the TMS budget to FY 2011/12 levels.

#### VI. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. FY 2013/14 – 2017/18 Transportation Improvement Program Amendment

Staff emailed a TIP-amending resolution that was approved by the Governing Board Dec. 11. The resolution contained 10 items that staff will review with the committee.

B. FY 2014/15 – 2015/16 Unified Planning Work Program

MPO staff will brief the committee on the upcoming process to develop a new two-your planning work program. As a planning organization receiving federal planning funds, the MPO is required to detail the various tasks proposed to be accomplished through the use of federal funds. Most tasks are tied to expenditures related to the salary/benefits and operational costs for the MPO. A portion of the funds are utilized for consulting services to support in-house staff efforts.

C. Horizon Award Nominations

Staff will update the committee that this is the final opportunity to nominate projects, plans and policies for recognition at the Jan. 22 event. Committee members are encouraged to nominate projects or policy initiatives within their jurisdictions, or in other jurisdictions. Nominations are due January 10.
