*With Clay Ervin no longer the TAC representative for the Town of Howey-in-the-Hills, a new Vice Chairman is needed. The chairman will call for nominations.*

**C. Recommend Approval to Amend FY 2014/15-2018/19 Transportation Improvement Program**

*The FDOT has programmed \$213,109 in rail safety funds into the current fiscal year of the FDOT Work Program. The funds would be utilized for safety improvement in Lake County at the crossing of CR 448A over the Florida Central Railroad. For the project to move forward, the MPO must amend the current five-year Transportation Improvement Program to include the project. Action is requested to recommend amendment of the MPO's five-year program to add the rail safety project.*

**D. Recommend Approval to Amend FY 2014/15 – 2015/16 Unified Planning Work Program**

*The two-year work program requires an amendment to update financial information for FY 2015/16. The amendment updates the final dollar figures for four grants received by the MPO: a Federal Highway Administration planning grant (\$531,543), a Federal Transit Administration planning grant (\$120,184), and a Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged grant for each county (Sumter \$20,491; Lake \$25,308). Staff recommends approval of the amendment which would update financial tables for FY 2015/16.*

**E. Recommend Approval of FY 2015/16 – 2019/20 Transportation Improvement Program and Recommend to Close Public Review Period**

*The five-year Transportation Improvement Plan document is based on several funding sources, especially the FDOT Tentative Work Program. Each year, FDOT conducts a process of proposing a Tentative Work Program, which occurred in December 2014. The tentative program becomes final as of July 1 of each year and the new document covers the period from July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2020. Therefore, the MPO is required to adopt a new five-year Transportation Improvement Program in order to concur and to be consistent with the projects in the FDOT program. The committee is requested to recommend to the Governing Board to close the public comment period and to grant final approval of the new five-year Transportation Improvement Program.*

**F. Recommend Approval of 2019/20-2034/35 List of Priority Projects and Recommend to Close Public Review Period**

*The annual process of prioritizing projects for funding has been ongoing since January and the MPO's Prioritization Process Subcommittee has vetted local projects to create a final List of Priority Projects. FDOT is required by law to utilize the MPO's document as the department programs funds for projects in the next FDOT Tentative Work Program. Adjustments have been made to the draft document approved in April resulting in a final document ready for approval. Questions or suggestions are welcomed as part of the committee review process. Once questions and concerns are addressed, the committee is requested to recommend to the Governing Board to close the public comment period and to approve the final document.*
