Mr. Fish gave an update on the progression of CR 466 from US 441 to US 301. Brief discussion regarding US 27 Reliever Study. The MPO would like to put a project into the 2035 LRTP. Public meetings for an ETDM would address the preferred alignment and impacts. MPO staff will research the previous study files done by Lake County. Brief discussion regarding the CR 470 planning screen and items in the interlocal.

Discussion ensued regarding the Bushnell multimodal project that received partial funding. The project will be on the next priority list for the remaining funding. Further discussion regarding Sumter County priorities.

V. Project Prioritization – County Roads Sumter County

- CR 470 from SR 93 (I-75) to Lake County, widen to 4 lanes
- CR 466A from SR 35 (US 301) to Buena Vista, widen to 4 lanes

- CR 466A from Sumter County to SR 25/500 (US 27/441), widen to 4 lanes
- CR 48, US 27 to CR 470, widen to four lanes
- CR 470 from Sumter County to CR 33/CR 48, widen to 4 lanes
- US 27 Reliever from SR 25/500 (US 27/441) to SR 44, new reliever
- CR 48 from Sumter County to CR 33, corridor study
- Leesburg By-Pass, for SR 44 to SR 25 (US27), new reliever
