Consideration to approve Resolution 2026-6 Adopting the FY 2027-2031 Transportation Improvement Program.** The five-year Transportation Improvement Program document is based on several funding sources, including the FDOT Tentative Work Program and the Florida Turnpike Enterprise Work Program. The DRAFT TIP for FY 2027-2031 will be presented for adoption at the MPO Governing Board Meeting on June 17, 2026.

- B. Consideration to approve Resolution 2026-7 Adopting the 2026 List of Priority Projects.** The List of Priority Projects (LOPP) is a document that all Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are required to develop annually. The LOPP represents the unfunded transportation improvements that were not programmed for the following five-year period, in order of priority. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) uses each MPO's LOPP to aid in their decisions as to which projects should be added to their Work Program each year. The Lake~Sumter MPO approves its LOPP annually. The LOPP represents those projects that have not yet been programmed but are considered high priorities by the MPO.

Staff recommend approval of Resolution 2026-7 Adopting the 2026 LOPP.

- C. Consideration to approve Resolution 2026-8 Adopting the Lake~Sumter MPO Vision Zero Safety Action Plan (VZAP).** The Vision Zero Safety Action Plan identifies the region's high-risk network, corridors, and intersections, and outlines targeted safety strategies aligned with FHWA best practices.

The University of Central Florida was awarded a \$689,992 grant from USDOT Safe Streets for All (SS4A) program to work in coordination with the Lake-Sumter MPO to create the Lake-Sumter Vision Zero Action Plan. This plan emphasizes data-driven methods to identify high-risk locations and identify targeted interventions to reduce all killed and serious injury crashes to zero in the Lake-Sumter region.

Over the past decade, Lake and Sumter Counties have experienced 73,555 crashes resulting in an estimated \$14.5 billion in economic losses, with 77% of those costs tied to 4,539 fatal and serious injury crashes. The guiding vision of the plan emphasizes collaborative action to prevent fatal and serious injury crashes and to create safer, more livable communities throughout the region.

Staff recommend approval of Resolution 2026-8 Adopting the Lake~Sumter MPO VZAP.

A. 2026 Congestion Management Process (CMP) Update –The DRAFT Congestion Management Process (CMP) Dashboard is now available for viewing.

- The **CMP** is a management system and process conducted by Lake~Sumter MPO to improve safety and reliability of traffic operations by providing strategies to reduce travel demand on the roadway network or providing improvements to the overall transportation network.
- The **CMP Dashboard** is a supporting tool that visualizes the existing transportation system, performance, and congested corridors. This draft CMP Dashboard is a part of CMP Phase 1 update efforts. Phase 2 will begin after July 2026.
- Some highlights of the CMP Dashboard include:
 - 2025 Annual Average Daily Traffic
 - 2025 Truck Volumes
 - 2028 forecast AADT data
 - Safety and Crash data from the LSMPO Vision Zero Action Plan
