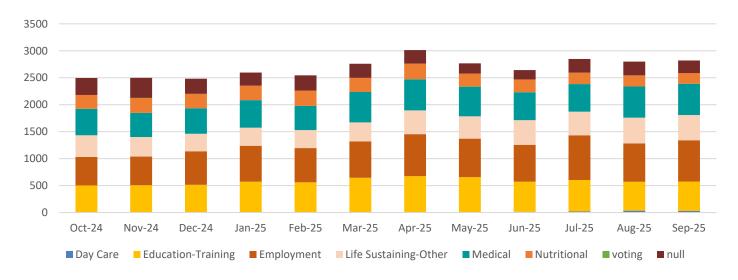

Figure 1: Trips by Trip Purpose

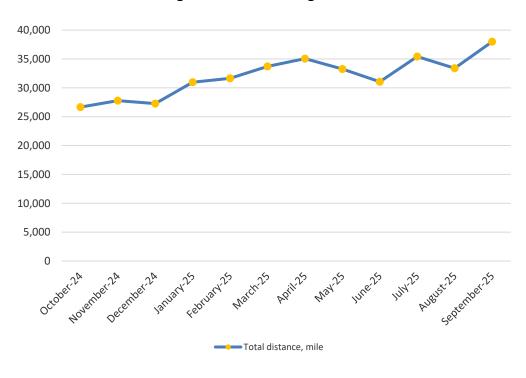

Figure 2: Total Passenger Miles

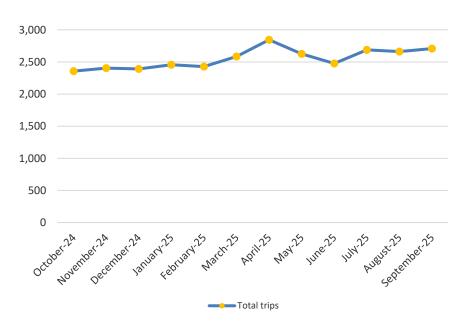

Figure 3: Total Passenger Trips

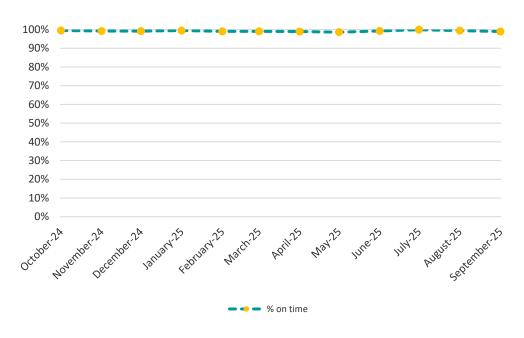

**Figure 4: On-Time Performance** 

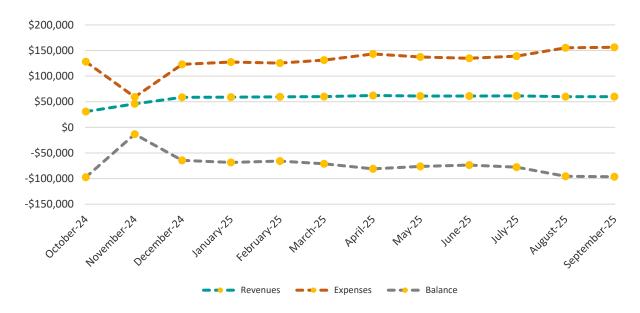

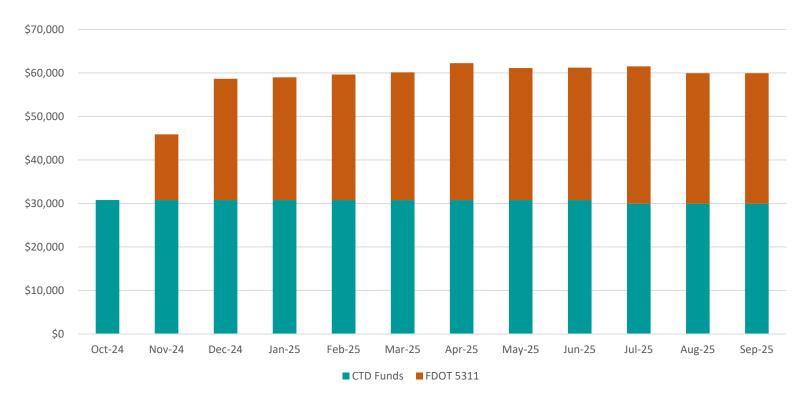

**Figure 6: Sumter County Transit Revenue** 

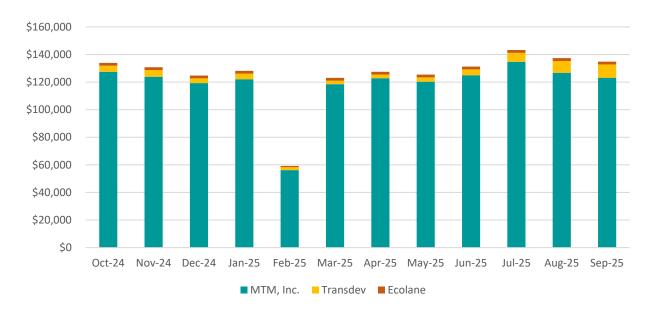

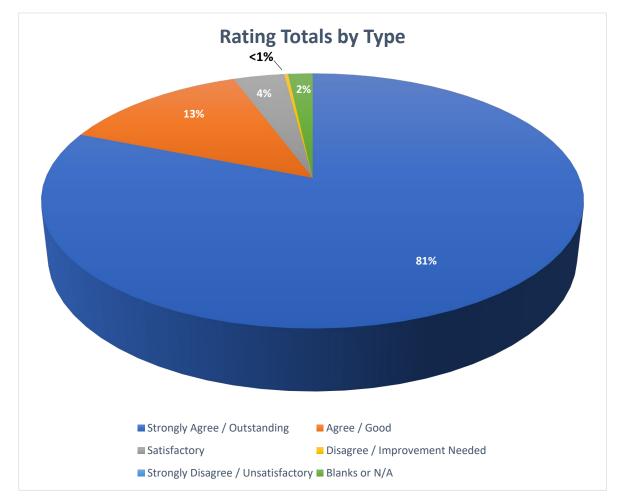


Figure 9: Survey Rating Totals by Type (July 2023 – September 2025)
