

- Regional Priorities are stalled




Partially Funded vs. Fully Funded

Project Development & Environment Study

Design concept options and their social and environmental effects are examined.

Detailed construction plans are prepared.

Entails acquisition of any necessary right-of-way, based on the design plans.

Includes agency coordination and obtaining necessary permits for project to move forward.

The project is built during this phase.

Construction Engineering and Inspection

Contracted service that administers, monitors, and inspects construction projects on behalf of FDOT.







More Transportation Alternative Funding - (\$2.5 Million / Year)

Funding Considerations:



Implementing the LRTP through the LOPP

- Annual LOPP Discussion Use LRTP and Cost Feasible Implementation Plan to discuss project funding and the need to reserve funding to accumulate for project programming
- New LOPP (first 10 years of Cost feasible Plan) Outlines project phases and timeline for construction for 20+ years to better understand the transportation planning and future funding needed to implement a project through construction
- New Call for Projects New Box funding program will allow for smaller push button projects to be funded with MPO funding support
- Local Funding Local funding discussions can happen annually for advancing project with Federal / State / Local partnerships






TIP Overview

Funding Breakdown per Category









